Ahoy Mates!

Some of the really neat things about SOS, among our social events and sailing activities—day-sails and weekend sails—are our bareboat charters and, over the years, a number of extended sails on the Chesapeake Bay. These Bay sails typically last a week or more allowing boats to visit destinations more distant than is possible in a two-or three-day weekend sail. Such cruises afford crew an opportunity to become more familiar with a boat's systems, equipment and operations than would be possible during a weekend sail. They build our sailing knowledge and allow members a chance to establish and strengthen lasting friendships from the shared experience.

This year, on our Chesapeake Bay extended cruise south, I am thinking of our upcoming 46th Anniversary Party. And, I am wondering about past voyages—where did they go? How many boats? How many crew? Previous trips have explored the Chesapeake Bay north of Annapolis: Anchorages and overnights in the Sassafras River, Worton Creek, the C&D Canal, and Havre de Grace. Recently, a friend fondly reminisced of a sunset cruise aboard Skipjack Martha Lewis and dinner in a water-front restaurant where glistening light from a rising full moon reflected off the Bay—a wistful memory. Another sail to the south made stops that included Solomons, Tangier Island, Mobjack Bay. Another impressionable trip.

In June of this year, led by Laura Gwinn on "Odyssey," five boats ventured south again. It was a rollicking sail from the Rhode River on a 180* course with 15-18 kt winds out of the southwest veering to northwest, and 1-2' chop on the bow, and later, the starboard quarter. (One of the best sails I've been on since the bareboat in the Stockholm Archipelago!!) We anchored/rafted in Mill Creek, Patuxent River. The next day we sailed as much as possible with SW winds until we turned into a strong west wind and motored up the Potomac to the St. Marys (no apostrophe) River.

Our anchorage was in front of the sailing center at St Mary's (apostrophe) College where the folks allowed us the use of showers and facilities. Our first night included a severe storm at midnight, the wind pushing us wildly, as we swung back and forth on the anchor!! Next day, we toured the excellent, informative exhibits and heard explanations from Historic St. Mary's City tour guides and were able to go aboard a replica/representation of the "Dove," one of two ships to land and establish the first colony in Maryland 1634. The "Arke," (as it was spelled then), 400 tons, with 140 colonists aboard, and the Dove, a 40-ton supply ship, set sail from England together. They encountered a storm early in the trip, and the Ark crew thought the smaller Dove was lost, until it showed up weeks later in Barbados where the Ark had made an extended stop. The ships then completed the journey together. The Dove made several crossings of the Atlantic carrying provisions and supplies to colonial settlers. In another area of the Historic St Mary's City site, researchers were working to excavate the foundations of colonial buildings and other buried artifacts. We also toured several replicas of historical buildings. The tour guides wore period costumes, and they were happy to explain the history, their work and the development of the historic site.

The next day, we headed to a quiet night rafted together in Mill Creek off the Great Wicomico. And then "motor-slogged" into wind and nasty 1-2' chop to Deltaville at the mouth of the Rappahannock. There, at Safe Harbor Stingray Point Marina we enjoyed happy hour by the pool—reviewing our progress, trading stories, and arranging fixes for "whatever." (Next stops, Onancock and Crisfield, were too late for this edition of the Whisker Pole).

I wish everyone might enjoy and participate someday on one of these cruises. Laura has done a marvelous job leading the recent trips, with great help from Chuck Fort. Maybe next year?

Treasurer’s Report - Craig Coltharp
Craig presented this spreadsheet of 2020-2023 actuals, and 2024 budgeted. For the first time, the “Admin” category (insurance, lockers) has been broken out from “BOD”, but leaving Town Hall. Also, the Safety, Skippers, and First Mates categories have been broken out from Cruising.

Craig identified options to Increase Revenue: Increase Dues; Increase event charges.

Craig also identified options to Reduce Costs: Reduce costly facilities; Reduce Quality of events; Reduce/limit Reimbursements; Reduce Freebees.

Social – Janet Pennewell
SOS social events (parties) have become more expensive due to continuing huge increases in food prices. The 2024 Anniversary Party is being moved to Port Annapolis, but we need 15 boats to stay overnight at the

PA Marina to get the discount. The 2024 Seafood Feast is being moved to Lankford from Haven Harbor due to HH’s price rise.

Education – Jean Gough
Jean’s 7 slide Powerpoint presentation made these points: (1) Fireside Chats and Seminars break even, so these don’t need tweaking, and (2) the Profitability strategy for Spring Training has focused on extensive promotion to increase attendance, on limiting freebees, and on reducing costs of printing, facilities, and food — tell the AACC caterer we don’t eat as much as students!

Cruising – Carole Jordan
2024 Cruising Kickoff has been moved from the Doubletree to Galesville, so we can choose our own (lower cost) caterer. One problem we face with many prospective venues on the Western Shore is that they require us to use their restaurants. The 2024 Chili Cookoff will be held at the DNR facility, so folks will be able to drive in as well as sail.

Newsletter – Shirley Hollendursky
Shirley stated that the annual cost to print the hard copies of the Whisker Pole is about \$5000. Half the copies go to the Happy Hour coordinators, and half to members who elect to pay \$40 per year. This price would have to be raised to \$120 to cover actual costs.

The discussion that followed considered such possible strategies as printing only the most pertinent pages, having coordinators print copies themselves, or using some sort of QR codes or other techno approaches.

Brunch – Suzanne Vaughn
Suzanne responded to a couple of proposed ideas to reduce Brunch costs: (1) moving to a venue other than Doubletree (“unwieldy”), or (2) doing brunches on Saturdays rather than Sundays (would reduce participation). But increasing attendance would indeed help to reduce per person costs

(amortizing bartender and other fixed costs).

Membership
John McDonald reported that the number of life members is continuously declining (due to “Father Time”), but that the decline is being fully offset by new members joining. Phoning people who have failed to renew their membership has gotten a good response.

Hope Andruss stressed the importance of regional activities like Happy Hours and backyard barbecues, etc, since they are less intimidating for new or prospective members.

Safety – Joan Tannen
Joan reminded everyone that Flare and Safety Day will be held on 27 April. She also encouraged everyone to wear their PFDs.

Bareboat – Deb Kaufman
Deb thanked Doug Gage, who has just retired after 17 years of service as Bareboat Treasurer/Purser, passing the baton to Janet Pennewell. Doug stated that over this period the Bareboat program has generated a surplus of \$38K, \$14K of which has been transferred to the main Club account.

First Mates - Lora Donia
27 people attended the First Mate session at Spring Training; Lora will follow up with them. She is working to increase the number of FMs.

Bob Wright suggested that people who do not wish to appear in Whisker Pole photos should (please) avoid posing for photos.

MOTION to adjourn by Bob Wright, seconded by Nancy Parsons. **MOTION CARRIED.** Meeting adjourned at 2:30 pm.

First Mate Program

Bill Knapp, FM



When I first joined SOS, I was struggling with getting to know people. I did not understand many of the SOS procedures and wanted to go out sailing often. Then I heard about the Singles on Sailboats First Mate program. It is composed of a group of members who have received advanced training in sailing. They then use that knowledge to help people learn to sail.

I have always enjoyed helping people, so I investigated how to become a First Mate. I discovered that there are a number of benefits to becoming a First Mate. When one registers for a sail as a First Mate to be assigned by the coordinator the \$19 a day fee is waived. New skippers often request a First Mate, and so First Mates are more likely to be placed on a boat. Their key responsibility is to help the skipper operate the boat. If the skipper is disabled in any way, the First Mate is responsible for bringing the boat back to shore.

Have you thought about becoming a First Mate? To qualify as a FM you should have mastered the following skills:

- Have some knowledge of engines and their safe operation.
- Be able to dock a boat safely in various conditions.
- Have navigation skills, day and night (it might be after dark or in adverse weather when the boat is returned to dock).
- Have full knowledge and understanding of the Rules of the Road.
- Be able to conduct a MOB operation (it might be the skipper overboard).
- Operate the radio and be able to communicate how to use it.
- Operate fire and safety equipment and communicate how to use it.

- Have the ability to work with and instruct crew who may not be experienced.

The process is not hard; first one should speak with members of the First Mates' Advisory or other First Mates you may know. Ask the skippers you sail with if they think you are ready. Next check the SOS First Mate Self-evaluation form, which you can find on the SOS website under forms & such. Rate yourself on the skills listed. If you know how to do all the skills listed and can show this to the checkout skippers, you're ready!

Next, take a practice checkout cruise with a recognized checkout skipper who is willing to give you feedback. If they say you are ready, start the process of becoming a FM.

There are 5 steps:

1. Complete Level I, II and III of the basic skills process.
2. Sail as crew with SOS a minimum of 3 weekends.
3. Ask 3 SOS skippers to provide a reference.
4. Fill out and submit the First Mate Candidacy Resume and the First Mate Self-evaluation forms.
5. Watch for a letter from First Mates' Advisory.

You will be notified of your acceptance as a candidate, as will Safety and Cruising. If you are not accepted, you will receive information on why and what to do to become qualified. Once you are formally accepted as a First Mate Candidate, you have 1 year to successfully complete 2 checkout cruises with 2 checkout skippers. You may take up to 3 checkout cruises.

Going through this process hones your sailing skills and identifies ones you need to improve. I have thoroughly enjoyed going through the process and becoming a FM. I hope you do as well.

The 2024 "Dinghy Dance!"



Are you good at getting into a dinghy in deep water? That's one of the things we work on at the Dinghy Dance.

This fun training session focuses on the effective and safe use of dinghies. Since the training is held at a private pool with a real dinghy, we are able to jump into the water and practice getting in and out of a dinghy on land and in deep water.

We test some of the techniques that experienced dinghy users rely on, like a stepping strap or a line with knots in it tied across the dinghy. Last year almost every participant who tried to get into the dinghy in deep water was able to using our tried-and-true techniques!

In addition, we have videos on different types of PFDs, on how to put a PFD on in the water, on which PFDs will give you the most protection if you fall out of a boat, and on how to inspect and maintain your Inflatable PFD.

We jump in the pool wearing different types of PFDs to experience how they vary.

We even have two people jump in with an inflatable PFD so participants can observe how the inflatable reacts.

The Dinghy Dance is scheduled for Sunday, July 21 from 1:00 to 3:30. Bring a towel and wear a bathing suit, because we are not offering a place to change your clothes.
