CLEARING THE BALTIMORE CHANNEL AFTER THE KEY BRIDGE COLLAPSE

Our November brunch speaker, Paul Hankins, was a key player in leading the salvage efforts required to clear the Baltimore Channel and reopen access to the Port of Baltimore after the collapse of the Key Bridge on March 26th. The collapse of the Key Bridge required immediate mobilization of salvage assets as well as coordination of multiple salvage efforts across the breadth of the response.

Paul is a senior executive civilian holding the title of the Director of Salvage Operations within the office of the [U.S. Navy] Supervisor of Diving and Salvage and Director of Ocean Engineering. This team, known as SUPSALV, is part of the Naval Sea Systems Command located in the Washington Navy Yard. SUPSALV supports the Army Corps of Engineers in their mission of maintaining federal waterways.

Paul will describe how the channel was successfully cleared within 77 days.

December 15th Brunch 150th Anniversary of Thomas Point Shoal Lighthouse

John Potvin, Lighthouse Manager will share the history of the last surviving Screwpile lighthouse in the world, in its original location. Built in 1875, it is still acting as a navigational buoy today. 150 years later. Hear about the history of the lighthouse and bringing it to the age of automation. This presentation will feature the formation of a collaborative group to restore the lighthouse and provide public access. He started working as a volunteer Preservationist in 2015, then trained to be a Docent and provided guided tours to tourists. In his new capacity as the Manager, he has many responsibilities including the restoration of the structure and has raised over half a million dollars for its restoration.

VIEW FROM THE BRIDGE

Dear Fellow Sailors.

This is the season we cherish most prime sailing weather, with the October winds

filling our sails. It's a time to be present, not rushing toward Thanksgiving or the New Year, but appreciating the gentle warmth of an autumn sun and the rhythm and percussion of water against the hull. These days offer us space for reflection, free from the distractions of repairs, haul outs, or barnacle scrubs. We can take bearings on where we are and chart a new course for where we want to go.

Recently, Yolo's anchor chain became entangled by a massive ball of sea grass. It was too heavy on the chain for the windlass to pull up the anchor! First Mates: Lora Donia. A First Mate meeting was held on September 20th to discuss recruitment, FM sailing requirements. and proposed educational sessions for the coming year. First Mates are reminded that they are expected to sail one weekend (or 2 day sails) as a First Mate at least once during the sailing season. The First Mate program welcomes our newest candidate, Deb Kuba. A motion was adopted stating that FMs will not pay the cruising fee, whether placed as working FM or not.

<u>Membership:</u> Pat Tracey, Gail Williams. Six new members were mailed a New Member packet in September 2024. Gail will retire as co-chair after November, lining up a replacement...

Newsletter: Shirley Brooks-Hollendursky. The 20-page October Whisker Pole was mailed to 40 members and 0 Happy Hour Coordinators at a cost of \$346.20. This equals to \$8.66 per printed copy. Expenditure of \$350 was authorized for Acrobat Pro 2020 for Julie Fort, who will take over as Editor beginning with the December 2024 issue.

Public Relations: Karl Scible, Janet Gonski. Public Relations has been in touch with volunteers from last year's Lights Parade and we are setting up work dates to de-construct last year's design as well as organize for a new version. We will reach out to last year's work crew members and to a few others who have already expressed interest, and to ask them each to invite a mentee or a new-ish member they may have met to share a work session or two.

<u>Safety</u>: Joan Tannen. Nothing new to report this month.

Skippers Advisory: Sandy Rosswork. One new skipper joined in September. Also, one new "pending" skipper is working on completing his profile.

Social: Janet Pennewell . Have been working to get tentative dates lined up for next year's Anniversary Party at Port Annapolis (June 21-22) and the Seafood Feast at Lankford (August 16-17). Assembling a complete notebook of documentation around this year's events. Need someone to organize regional pre-Thanksgiving dinners, or won't happen — NOT part of Social Committee portfolio. Need a new Social Chair for next year.

Old Business:

The Ad Hoc committee charged with looking broadly at issues affecting skippers and the club sailing program (Sandra Rosswork, Chair, Chuck Fort, Carole Jordon, Dennis Krizek, Craig Coltharp, and Susan Zevin), has met twice, and presented a number of recommendations.

Issue: Cost to Sail. The current administrative fee charged by SOS to sail for a day is \$19. The recommendation is to raise this to \$24, beginning with the 2025 sailing season. This will be considered in discussion of the 2025 Budget at the next BOD meeting.

<u>Issue: Definition of "skipper"</u>. Several different terms, data lists, and procedures are currently used to define and count SOS skippers. The committee has recommended a number of changes in order to be more transparent and accurate,

Issue: Skipper Participation.

There are not enough participating skippers who sail regularly on SOS cruises to handle the number of crew signed up for many sails. To increase skipper participation, a series of incentives for several levels of skipper participation were formally adopted, conferring varying benefits, including up to 3 vouchers which may be used at a major party or brunch.

<u>Issue: Guest Skippers</u>. The current formal requirement for an SOS skipper to obtain the approval of Skippers Advisory chair before inviting another skipper to sail with them to an SOS event was eliminated.

New Business:

Extensive discussion of 2025 Spring Training volunteer fee allowances (pay full, pay half, or free) — do they get to see the classes they want; do they eat.... Consideration of this was deferred to the New Board at next BOD meeting.

SOS Wellness Protocol Revised (3/7/2024)

All participants attending SOS in-person events should be feeling well. They should not attend an event if they have symptoms of a communicable respiratory or gastrointestinal illness, are "feeling like something is coming on," have a recent significant exposure to someone with a communicable respiratory or gastrointestinal illness, or have not waited a recommended isolation time after a recent respiratory or gastrointestinal infection. In addition, a skipper/host may have further requirements or request other preventive measures (for example, crew or guests having received the currently recommended COVID-19 vaccine or wearing masks when below deck). All in-person participants should expect to be denied admission without a refund if they fail to comply with this policy.

So, What Are the Serious Board Awards?

<u>Commodore's Award:</u> The Board of Directors established the annual Commodore's award so that the highest-ranking officer of the Club could extend public recognition and many thanks to an individual who has made significant contributions in fostering the goals of Singles on Sailboats, and who continues to contribute to many aspects of the Club. Nominations for the award are accepted from the general membership.

Ed Klein Member of the Year Award: Singles on Sailboats owes its beginnings to Ed Klein. He co-sponsored the first rafts of two or three boats, the first brunches, the first social gatherings. But Ed offered more. He would teach you to sail without regard for your past experience or future expectations. Ed would take you aboard his boat, The Mai Kai, give you the helm, and develop your skills. He would challenge you to extend your horizons. He was one of those unique individuals who shared his joy of sailing with you. Ed sailed beyond this world in 1987. Nominations for the award come from the general membership.

Elinor W. "Elli" Abramson Award for Contributions to SOS Education Programs: Eli Abramson created many new educational programs for the members of Singles on Sailboats. After serving on the Board of Directors for two years, she gradually built an allencompassing education program that provides the opportunity to broaden one's knowledge of sailing at minimal cost. She transformed the spring education program so that it attracts more participants than any other SOS event. Elli sailed beyond this world in 1992. Nominations are accepted from the general membership, and the Education Committee Chairperson(s) recommends the recipient.

<u>Rookie of the Year Award:</u> Singles on Sailboats attracts many new sailors each year. The Board of Directors established the annual Rookie of the Year Award to recognize the individual who, in his or her first-year sailing with SOS, demonstrates superior interest in and learning about sailing, and who becomes highly involved in one or more of the many SOS programs. Nominations for the award come from the general membership.

You Ought to be in Pictures: The 2024 SOS Photo Contest

Have you taken **stellar shots** of this year's SOS activities? If so, keep on shooting! If not, start taking photos to be submitted to the 20234 Photo Contest.

1. Entries must be taken at events with other SOS members in 2024 by the member of SOS submitting the photo. Note: If you are in the photo, you <u>cannot</u> have been the photographer and your submission will not be accepted (unless on a tripod with a timer, which is acceptable). A photo does not necessarily have that event as a theme (a picture of Annie Anchorage at a raft-up or the sunset seen from a raft-up is acceptable, even though there is nothing in the picture to prove that it was taken at a raft-up or cruise.) We are on the "Honor System". An SOS event can be cruising, day-sail, a brunch, seminar, destination cruise, shore party, etc. Happy Hours are <u>not included</u>.

2. Each photo **must** identify at which SOS event it was taken and the name of the photographer.

3. This is an amateur photographer contest. Professional photographers - i.e. anyone who earns more than 50 percent of his or her annual income from photography – are excluded from the contest.

4. Each member may submit up to a **total of eight (8) photos**. The photographs should be submitted in a 5" x 7" format or the coordinator will crop it for you.

5. Photos may **NOT** be edited to achieve color balance that reflects the scene as you observed it. Heavily manipulated photos are **not** eligible. Cropping is the only acceptable edit. We ask the photographer to 'Suggest' a category, but the Judge has the discretion to change the category.

Categories: People, Bay scenes (including sunsets), Sailboats (sailboats under sail, raft-ups), and Destination

Cruises. The Destination Cruises category includes photos taken during the actual SOS destination cruises and photos taken on days when traveling prior to or after a destination cruise, provided the photos are from the same area. (A destination cruise of the Mediterranean mav not include photos from а layover in Amsterdam.)



Other Useful information: Submit your photos in digital format. Send photos attached to emails, Drop Box or contact Bob Wright for instructions to upload to the Photo Editor's Google drive. Submit photos in high resolution. The photos will be enlarged to 5" x 7" (and larger to project to a screen). If the photo is fuzzy, it reduces your chance of winning. Photos not submitted in the 5" x 7" format will be cropped to that format. Smart phone photos may be submitted. Please select high resolution for photos in your smart phone setup.

Judging: The Photo Contest Manager and Judge may put your photos in the best applicable category. There will be First, Second and Third Place Awards for each of the four categories and also a Grand Prize Award. The photos will be judged by a greater Annapolis area professional photographer from outside the club. The judging will be blind, so the Judge will not know which photographer took which photograph. The Judge may add a fourth-place award in any category, if deemed necessary due to the quantity and quality of entries in a category (<u>not to exceed</u> <u>a total of 13 awards</u> including the Grand Prize Photograph).


